Reflection

The gospel is that we do not try to attain a righteousness that our abilities can develop. Rather, we are to receive a righteousness provided through supernatural acts of God in history—the miraculous birth, sin-bearing death, and death-defeating resurrection of Christ. We need to rely on God—just as Abraham eventually learned that he needed the miraculous work of God to provide him with a son and heir. As Abraham needed to switch his faith from his own efforts to God's supernatural work, so these Galatian Christians need to look back to Christ's work, rather than at their own law-keeping efforts.

Q. 31. With whom was the covenant of grace made?

A. The covenant of grace was made with Christ as the second Adam, and with all the chosen ones in him as his seed.

Q. 33. Was the covenant of grace always administered in one and the same manner?

A.The covenant of grace was not always administered in the same manner; the administrations of it under the Old Covenant were different from those under the New.

Q. 34. How was the covenant of grace administered under the Old Covenant?

A. The covenant of grace was administered under the Old Covenant by promises, prophecies, sacrifices, circumcision, the Passover, and other symbols and ordinances, all of which foreshadowed the Christ to come and were sufficient for that time to build up the chosen ones in faith in the promised Messiah, by whom they then had full remission of sin and eternal salvation.

Q. 35. How is the covenant of grace administered under the New Covenant?

A. Under the New Covenant, when Christ was exhibited as the true substance of what had been previously foreshadowed, the same covenant of grace was and still is to be administered in the preaching of the Word and the administration of the sacraments of baptism and the Lord's Supper, in which grace and salvation are held forth in more fullness, evidence, and effectiveness to all nations.

The Sermon
Galatians: The Gospel of Freedom in Jesus Christ
"Father Abraham"
Galatians 4:21-5:1
Rev. Alex Woods

Tell me, you who desire to be under the law, do you not listen to the law? ²² For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by a slave woman and one by a free woman. ²³ But the son of the slave was born according to the flesh, while the son of the free woman was born through promise. ²⁴ Now this may be interpreted allegorically: these women are two covenants. One is from Mount Sinai, bearing children for slavery; she is Hagar. ²⁵ Now Hagar is Mount Sinai in Arabia; she corresponds to the present Jerusalem, for she is in slavery with her children. ²⁶ But the Jerusalem above is free, and she is our mother. ²⁷ For it is written,

"Rejoice, O barren one who does not bear; break forth and cry aloud, you who are not in labor! For the children of the desolate one will be more than those of the one who has a husband."

²⁸ Now you, brothers, like Isaac, are children of promise. ²⁹ But just as at that time he who was born according to the flesh persecuted him who was born according to the Spirit, so also it is now. ³⁰ But what does the Scripture say? "Cast out the slave woman and her son, for the son of the slave woman shall not inherit with the son of the free woman." ³¹ So, brothers, we are not children of the slave but of the free woman.

¹ For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

The Big Idea:

Since the grace of God is totally free, we must not think there's anything we can add to it to gain God's favor. To realize this, we must recognize our only two options before God, reject slavery, and then embrace freedom.

1. Recognize the Options (vv.4:21-23)

2. Reject Slavery (vv.4:24-27)

3. Embrace Freedom (vv.4:28-5:1)

Questions for personal reflection and family/Community Group discussion:

- 1. What elements of the worship service were particularly helpful and encouraging for you? Why?
- 2. This entire passage hinges on Paul looking back to the Old Testament. Where does he take the Galatians in Jewish history? Why do you think he chooses to reference these stories and passages?
- 3. Take a moment to read Genesis 16:1–6. What do Abraham's actions in this account reveal about his attitude toward the promise of God that his wife would bear him a son? What is the result of his actions with Hagar in the immediate context?
- 4. Why would it have been surprising to the Judaizers to hear Paul identify them as children of Hagar, not of Sarah? How would the Judaizers have thought of themselves? Why might Galatians 4:25 have been particularly shocking, and even offensive, to Paul's Jewish opponents?
- 5. The other Old Testament passage referenced by Paul in this passage is Isaiah 54:1; he quotes it word for word. Read Isaiah 54:1–5. What promise is revealed in these verses? How does it relate to the overall message of the book of Galatians?
- 6. In what sense does the gospel bring freedom from slavery? What does it mean to live as a child in a relationship not enslaved to religion?
- 7. We have seen that Abraham's approach to the birth of Ishmael and his approach to the birth of Isaac can represent two different ways of relating to God. One way is by human effort and law; the other is through God's grace and faith. How can you tell when you are beginning to live by human effort and law, rather than by God's grace and faith? What warning signs might you identify in your thoughts, attitudes, and worship?
